
Underlying Issues


- Pastoral isolation and unmet (un-meetable) congregational hungers

- - Within contemplative practice that self-selects OUT (Incarnational logic)


Safe-Surfing (practical)

 Filtering software should be installed on each


 - All staff use of church computers should be for ministry/professional use ONLY




LIFE BEFORE THE COMPUTER
